

The Curry School of Education, Department of Leadership Foundations and Policy at the University of Virginia, invites applications for an Assistant, Associate Professor or Professor (open rank; advanced tenure-track or tenured depending upon hiring rank) position in the program area of social foundations (discipline open), beginning August 25, 2011.

The position is designed for a scholar whose work demonstrates sustained and rigorous critical and interpretive inquiry on contemporary issues in education within interest areas in fields such as socio-cultural perspectives in education, gender and equity, social change, diversity, critical theory, cultural historical theory, and/or international and comparative education. Faculty and students in the Social Foundations Program examine broad interdisciplinary questions related to education through interpretive, critical, and normative lenses in a program that is currently being redesigned. Consequently, we seek a scholar who is able to develop and strengthen the program's links to other programs throughout the University and to facilitate its focus on contemporary challenges.

/Qualifications: The candidate for this position must have an earned doctorate, will be a tenured (or advanced assistant) professor, have a strong record of research and publication, and demonstrated excellence in both teaching and advising. The ideal candidate will provide evidence of success in cross-school and interdisciplinary program building. Candidates must demonstrate an explicit commitment to, and accomplishments in, teaching, research, and/or service that contribute to advancing understanding and outcomes for underrepresented groups and to diversity more broadly.

/Responsibilities: Responsibilities include teaching and advising at the undergraduate, master's, and doctoral levels. The candidate is expected to be engaged in scholarly research and grant development activities, and have skill and experience in working with a wide range of educational practitioners and scholars. The ideal candidate would be able to teach in a variety of foundational areas in addition to his/her primary area of specialization and to practice an interdisciplinary perspective and relevant collaborative skills.
