The University has an enrollment of approximately 13,000 with 600 faculty and is organized into four colleges: Letters, Arts, and Social Sciences; Business and Economics; Education and Allied Studies; and Science. The Department of Educational Leadership offers programs leading to administrative credentials and MS degree. The department offers an Ed.D. degree program. *Mission:* to prepare and influence bold, socially responsible leaders who will change the world of schooling. Our central role is to ignite the leadership capacity needed to create vital, democratic and caring places for powerful teaching and learning.

DUTIES OF THE POSITION: Teach courses in the MS in the degree program that include Introduction to Research, Research in Educational Leadership, Graduate synthesis. Coordinate and advise a cohort of MS candidates. Supervise action research inquiry projects. Faculty have advising responsibilities, administrative and/or committee work, and are expected to assume college committee responsibilities. This position may also teach in the doctoral program.

QUALIFICATIONS: A doctorate degree in education, leadership, research or a field directly related to school leadership; significant knowledge of research in public schools, constructivist learning strategies, technology skills; public school work on equity of educational results, and experience in leading Masters degree thesis/projects. Demonstrated ability to teach, advise and mentor students from diverse educational and cultural backgrounds. Applicants must demonstrate a record of or potential for scholarly activity.

DESIRED QUALIFICATIONS: School or school district reform experience in leadership positions; commitment to working with school districts and diverse communities; online teaching experience; prior university teaching experience and service on dissertation committees.
