POSITION DESCRIPTION:

The primary responsibilities of this tenure-track position are: teaching educational leadership courses to master's and doctoral students, establishing a productive research agenda, advising master's and doctoral students, and serving on dissertation committees. Teaching responsibilities are contingent upon experience and interest and will also include making effective use of instructional technology where appropriate. The ideal candidate is expected to be a scholar practitioner who publishes high quality research and interacts with the broader educational community. There is also an expectation for service to the educational leadership program, College of Education, and broader University.

Our mission in the educational leadership program is to develop and support effective leaders for high-quality elementary/secondary education. In partnership with the global community, we identify and enhance individuals through degree and certification programs and support their lifelong learning through our conferences and publications. Our vision of effective leaders is working collaboratively as scholar-practitioners who foster the cognitive and affective development of all learners through technological, managerial, and interpersonal skills as well as through agile and creative habits-of-mind. - * Demonstrated capacity for achieving excellence in teaching.
- * Demonstrated potential for publishing in area of expertise.
- * Proven ability to be a scholar-practitioner.
- * Demonstrated commitment to anti-racist, anti-sexist, multicultural, democratic education.

PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS:

Preference is given to those with:

- * K-12 administrative and/or teaching experience, particularly within high-needs schools.
- * Capacity for collaboration with educational leaders in K-12 settings.
- * Demonstrated experience working with Hispanic communities.
- * Experience chairing doctoral dissertations.
- * Potential for publishing in area of expertise.
- * Active participation and leadership roles in state or national professional organizations.
- * Willingness to learn instructional technologies to support instruction.
