Department of Educational Administration Assistant Professor (tenure-line) Community Colleges/Higher Education

The Department of Educational Administration (EDAD) at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln is seeking to add a tenure-line faculty member to our growing community college leadership focus. The position is at the assistant professor rank and will contribute to current and future needs in our community college and higher education areas of study.

Within our programs, higher education administration is a concentration at the master's degree level and EDAD awards both the Ph.D. and Ed.D. with a specialization in Educational Leadership and Higher Education.

Community college leadership is a concentration within the Educational Leadership and Higher Education Specialization, available in our on-line Ed.D. degree or as a non-degree certificate.

Position Description:

This position will require the successful candidate to teach on-line courses, advise students, chair dissertations, and to be productive as a researcher and active in seeking external research support.

Minimum Qualifications:

- 1) Earned doctorate in Community College Leadership, Higher Education, Educational Administration/Leadership or equivalent area.
- 2) A research agenda focused on community colleges.

Preferred Qualifications:

- 1) The potential to generate external funding in support of a developed research agenda;
- 2) A record of research activity including conference presentations and publications;
- 3) Evidence of the ability to teach graduate level courses, including on line delivery, in the areas of community colleges (e.g., teaching and learning in the community college, community college leadership) as well as general higher education (e.g., history of higher education, administrative issues, organization and governance of higher education);
- 4) Evidence of the ability to teach quantitative research methods;
- 5) Evidence of the ability to advise and mentor graduate students; and
- 6) Experience as a faculty member or administrator in a community college.

Screening of Applicants will begin November 1, 2012 and continue until the positions are filled.
