Exceptional opportunities for talented and committed students interested in conducting rigorous scientific research that is relevant to education in the U.S.



The Institute of Education Sciences funds a network of Pre- and Postdoctoral Interdisciplinary Research Training Programs in the Education Sciences. Participants in these training programs will be prepared to contribute to the field of education sciences by conducting rigorous evaluation studies, developing new products and approaches that are grounded in a science of learning, and designing valid tests and measures. Fellows receive financial support, access to specialized resources and experts in the field of study and become part of an emerging national network of students, faculty and practitioners conducting interdisciplinary research in the education sciences.

Successful predoctoral fellows receive a Certificate in Education Sciences in addition to a doctorate in their discipline. A strong interest in and aptitude for advanced statistical training is required. Students must be U.S. citizens or permanent residents to receive fellowship support. Training program details and requirements are established by each participating institution.
